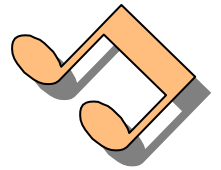

**Rebuilding, Restoring, Renewing  
Puerto Rico**

**Update from Dr. Josué Gomez-Menéndez. Incoming  
President of the Board of General Ministries,  
American Baptist Churches, USA**

Hurricane Maria hit Puerto Rico in every way it could. The biggest natural disaster to tear over our tropical island in many decades, the storm took so much from us. But it also showed that it's good to be part of a family—a great family joining with us on this journey of healing. The American Baptist family is one of the gifts that Maria gave to us.

At the start of the Advent season, my family received a gift, a string of battery-operated Christmas lights, from the Rev. Judy Fackenthal, president of ABCUSA. This is detail is significant because my home remains without electricity. As I write, it has been 75 days since Maria hit, and we continue to use a generator. My family hung the Christmas lights at the door between the living room and the terrace. Now, at night when everything is dark, everyone sees our Christmas spirit.

Last Sunday I awoke early for a brief jog before Sunday worship. I went to the sink, but nothing came out! The situation felt hopeless—75 days since Maria's landfall, and it's still like day zero. No electricity and no water. It's frustrating, unfair and wrong.

As I walked down the stairs, I saw our Christmas lights. I remembered that, for the last 2,000 years, a light has shown a path to hope for those still living in darkness—for the wise man, for the ones who work in the fields, for all those who are still looking! This holiday season, more than ever, I give God glory for the promise of light in the darkness—the darkness that still envelopes so much of my homeland, Puerto Rico.

Thank you , American Baptist family, for living this journey with us—for sharing goods, praying, texting, calling, and for your gifts to One Great Hour of Sharing that help us so much. But, more importantly, thank you for being part of our family.

May the blessing of light be yours, my sisters and brothers in Christ, in this holiest of seasons.

## **THE BOLICK REPORT** (excerpt—see the full report on the Missions Board) **CHILE—December 2017**



### **“Seed Bombs and the Kingdom of God”**

Nothing every turns out the way I imagined it. That’s a good thing. The ministries and projects we dream of or undertake, the words we speak, the prayers we utter, are like the seed and yeast Jesus mentions in his parables. They become something much more than we could have ever imagined or engineered. Yet God still asks us to imagine, and to plant seeds.

I am studying Permaculture these days. It is a method of designing productive ecosystems based on observation of natural ecosystems. One method used to recover and repair fields is to throw “seed-bombs” into them. These are a mix of clayey soil, compost, and vegetable, flower, or herb seeds, formed into a ball and thrown into the field. After time and rainfall, the balls break down and the seeds germinate. The compost and clay adds stability and nutrients.

What an image for the work of the kingdom, here in Chile and in your own place of service! I ponder it often as I reflect on the past year. Many times we have prayed about desired outcomes, hopes for projects, growth and transformation of people and relationships. Sometimes we grow weary praying, but keep plodding onward, at times forgetting the original goal. Then comes a day when we are chastened to realize that the prayer has been answered, the dream realized, but in ways we never imagined or expected.

**So here are a few of the surprising ways we have seen seeds planted begin to grow!**

### **Local Church Service**

Dwight finished a class this year with the leadership of our Temuco church, based on *Emotionally Healthy Spirituality* by Peter Scazzero. This is one of the most gratifying experiences of the year, seeing a real hunger for God, becoming mature in Christ, and relating in a healthy way to others, come to life in the leadership. Now these leaders are introducing the same themes in classes for the adult Sunday School. And we are beginning another study about spiritual formation with the leaders, discovering ancient/new paths in the church’s practice of spirituality.

### **Yarn Projects**

As Barb devotes most of her time now to the Girls’ Clubs, she serves in a consultant role to the three cooperatives she started. They all function with national leadership now, one in partnership with a municipality. Our good friend, Tomi Strock, a sheep rancher in Wyoming, has generously partnered with the cooperative in Repocura, helping them develop a market for their products in the United States.

### **Family Update**

Speaking of seeds growing into something magnificent, our sons have spent their entire lives here in Chile. Jack just graduated from high school, and Will is passing to eighth grade. (Their school year is March-December). They both love sports, Jack in mountain biking, and Will in training for a triathlon. Jack will be taking some time to get oriented to U.S. life before entering college late next year.

**We will be returning in April for home assignment for one year.** We have not taken a full year for home assignment since Will was born. We’re looking forward to spending time with you and letting our boys get to know their U.S. culture.

- Larry Davis, Harriet Rintz and family on the death of Janet Davis on December 4 at Spring House Estates.

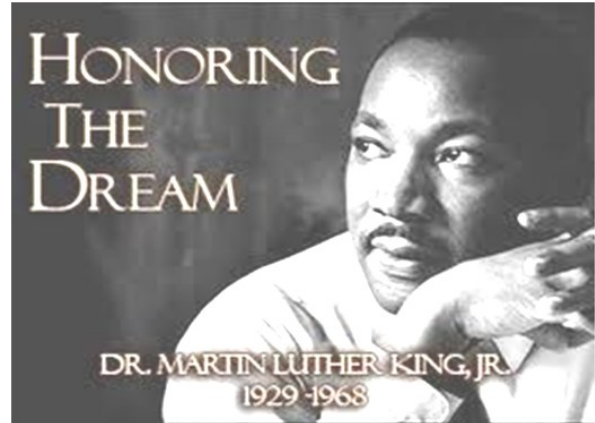

### **Parents' Night Out, January 5**

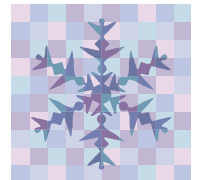
